

## Damaged or Destroyed Structures

It's proving to be a challenge to precisely quantify the structural losses in the 13 eastern Kentucky counties that were declared Federal Disaster Areas following the July 28, 2022 flood. According to Jesse Elbouab, Communications Director for Kentucky Emergency Management, "In the first few hours of the floods, it was evident that the damages would far exceed the threshold necessary for Kentucky to request a presidential declaration."

The below chart is based on the numbers of survivors who have applied and were awarded assistance from FEMA's Individual Assistance (IA) Program. The data accounts for damaged/destroyed homes and businesses.
